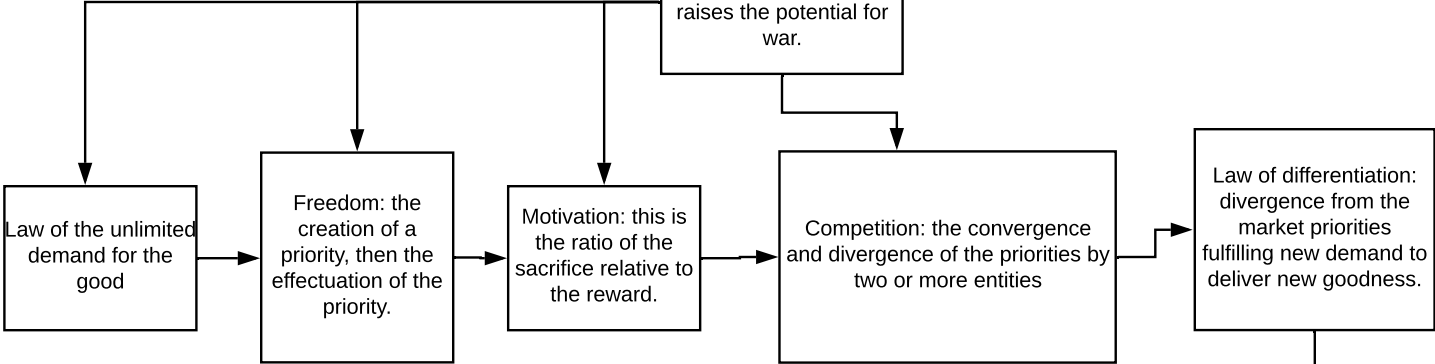


# The Nature & Causes of War & Conflicts

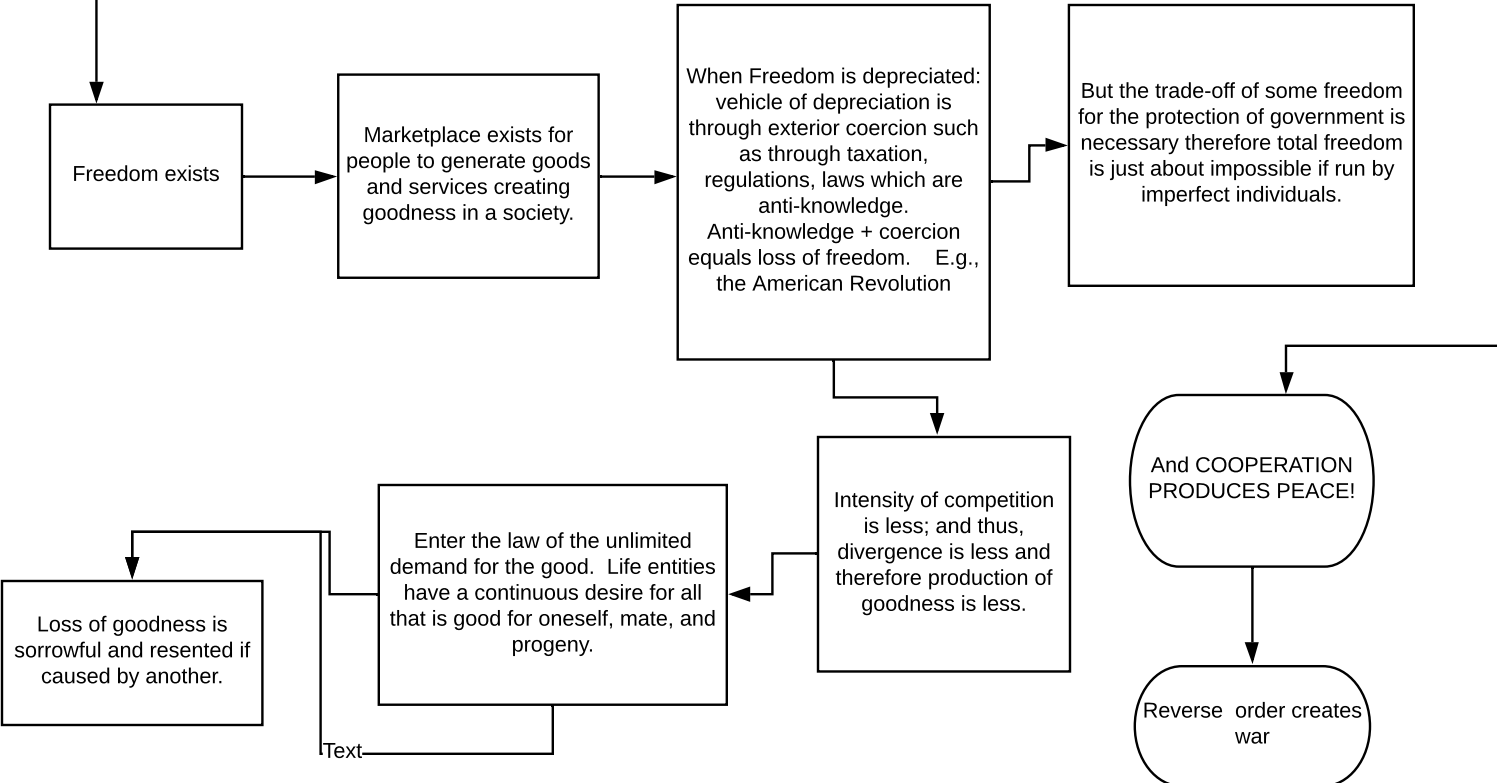
Ingredients of peace

war.

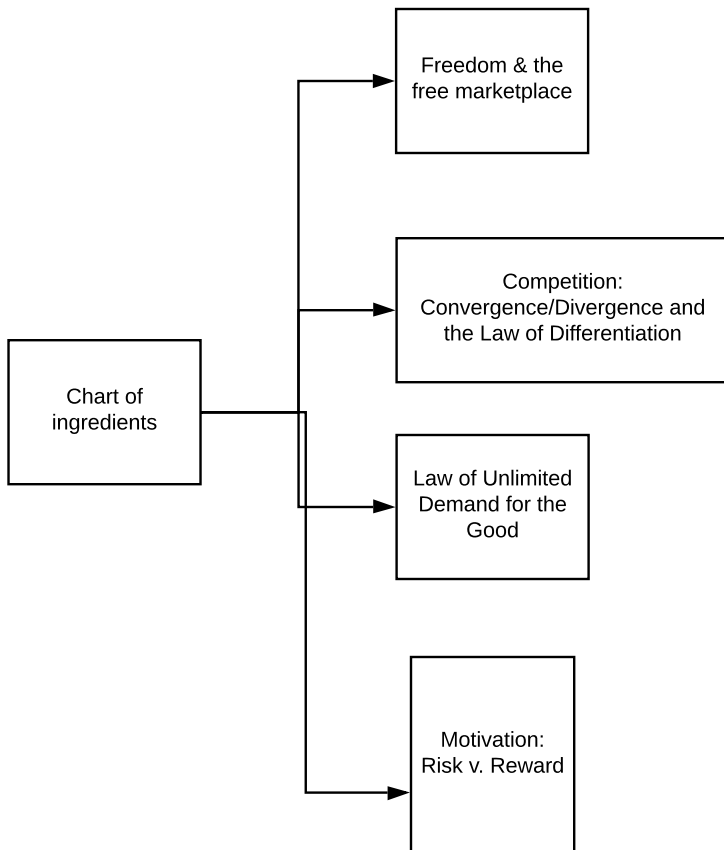
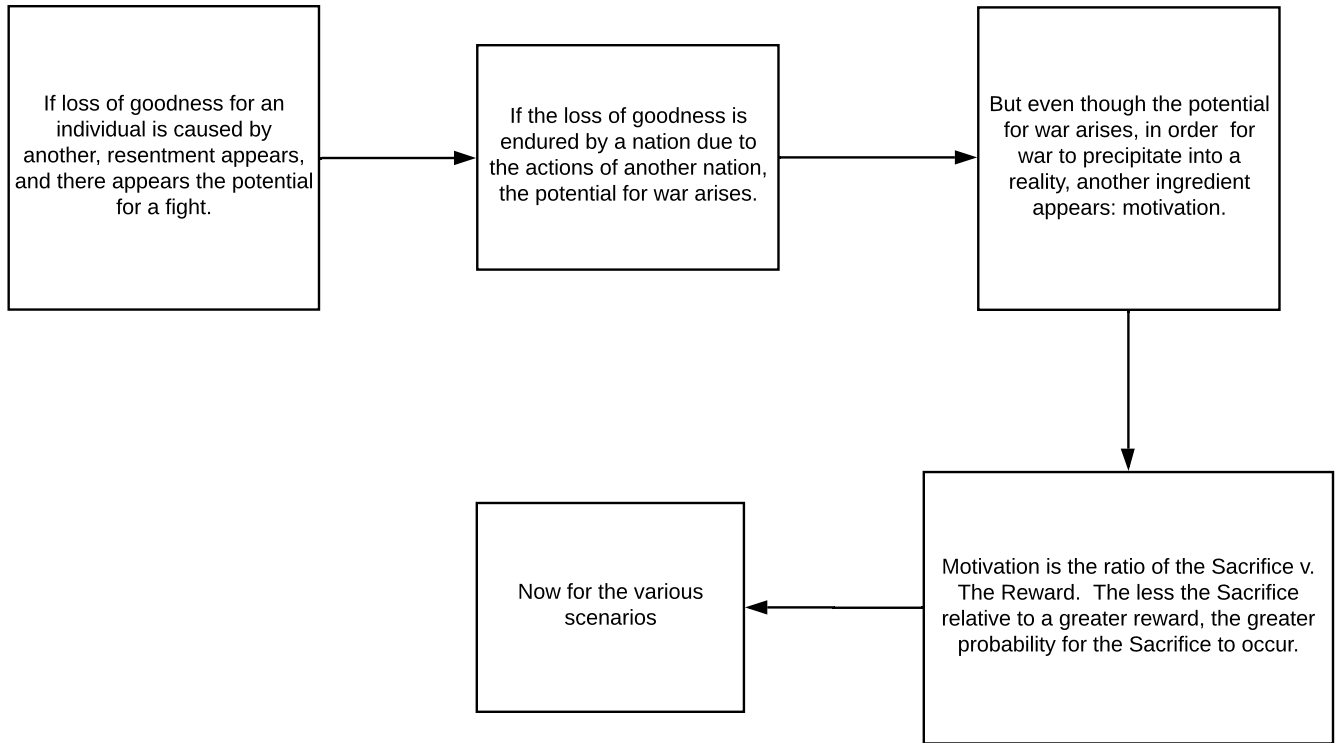


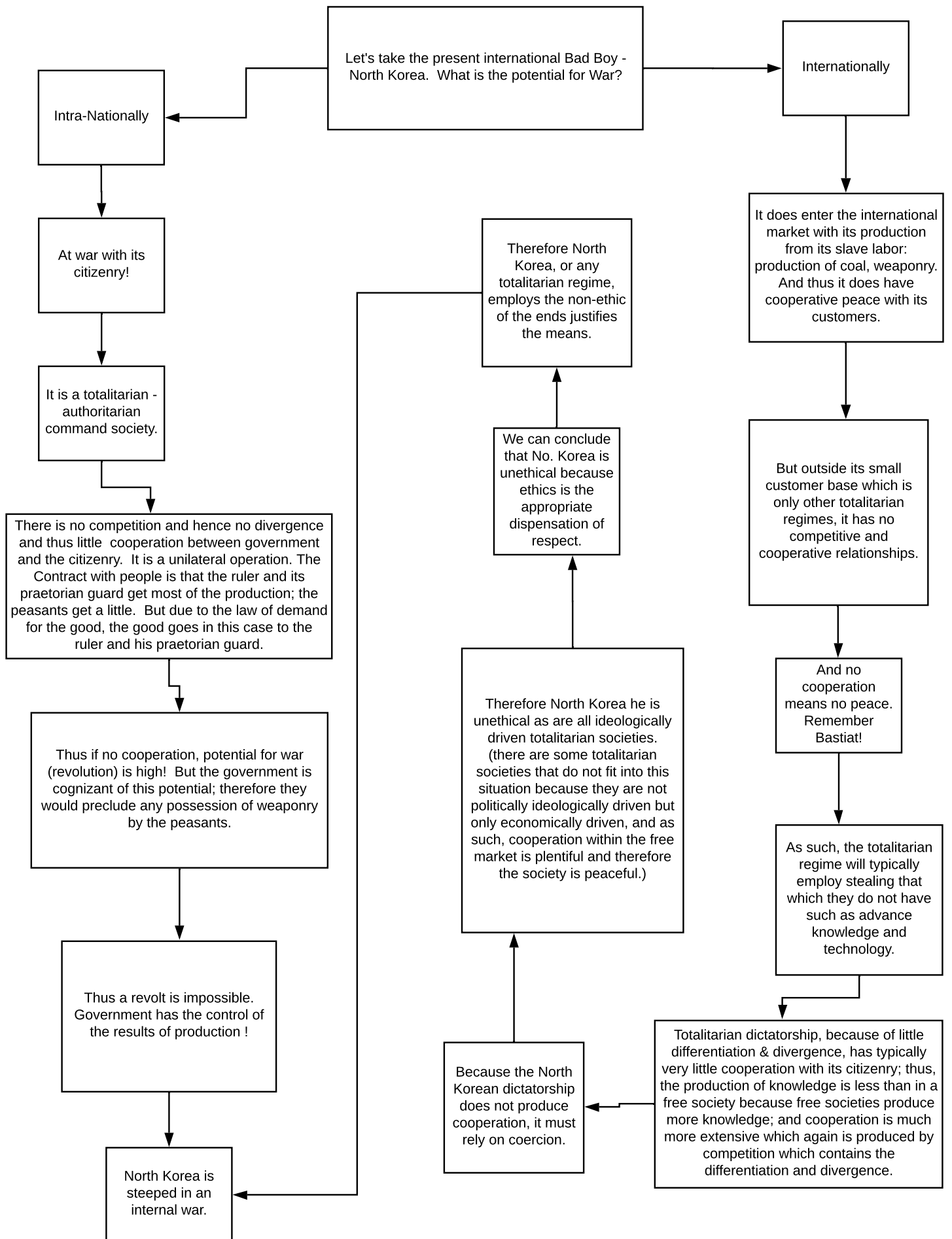
Peace = The Good + Freedom + Motivation + Competition (Law of Differentiation)

War = To the Inimitable Law of Demand for the Good + (-Freedom) + (+Motivation) + (-Competition)

The steps to the creation of any war. There are two starting points:  
1) Law of the unlimited demand for the good 2) freedom exists in a society, e.g. Western Societies, and freedom does not exist within a society, e.g. North Korea







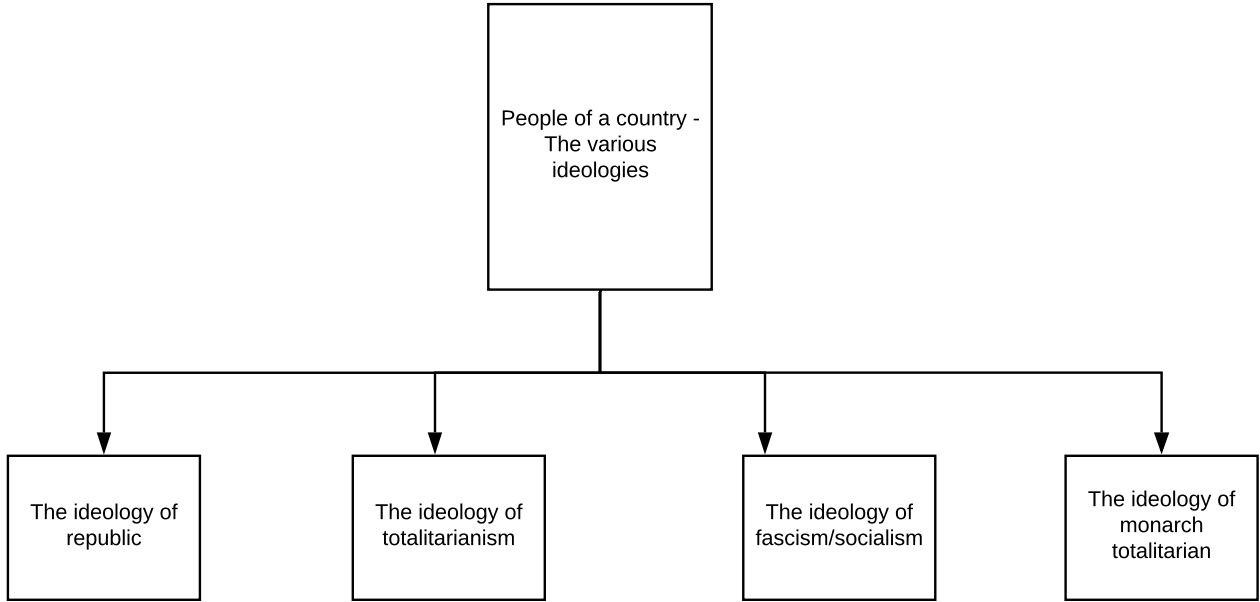
But as we just mentioned because of the non cooperation by North Korea, or any other totalitarian politically ideologically driven dictatorship, they are behind free societies technologically and behind in their living standard.

But we must not forget that the law of the unlimited demand for the good applies to all of life including the North Korean totalitarian regime as a nation which will also want more goodness to flow in their direction.

Although the potential for war with No. Korea exists because of the law of the unlimited demand for good, it is small because of the factor we have enumerated in the causes of war: motivation – the ratio of the sacrifice versus the reward.

When the sacrifice is large which is to go to war with the U.S. and when the sacrifice is dangerous which is to suffer the might of the U.S. armed forces, yet the reward is commensurately small (what would they gain from such a war), there would be a small probability that North Korea would initiate a war with this motivation as it is.

# Causes of War - part 2



If competition is added to any of these ideologies, two things can happen.

When it tries to compete divergence happens. Therefore, each of the ideologies will develop new ideas and new facets through their differentiation.

The ideologies begin to compete with each other, and each ideology tries to be the only ideology left that is they try to compete with each other.

Definition of Competition: the convergence and divergence onto/from the same priority .

The new ideas emanating from the ideologies maybe successful; maybe not! That's competition.
